tive on the Board of County Supervisors, I am excited about what we have been able to achieve together. Listening to your concerns, I have prioritized revitalization of Route 1, community safety, and improving the quality of life in our community. We have accomplished many goals while at the same time responding to hundreds of individual calls from community members requesting assistance.

I welcome the opportunity to serve as your representative and advocate. We have several projects in the pipeline on the path to completion. For example, the 2nd phase of the Route 1 widening project from Featherstone to Mary's Way is scheduled for completion this fall. The four-lane widening of Neabsco Mills Road, from Route 1 to Dale Boulevard, is scheduled for completion in the fall of 2024. The completion of these two roads offers our community greater connectivity, more sidewalks, and paths.

This past year we have been able to add 20 acres to Veterans Park, approve a new mixed- use North Woodbridge Town Center that will bring economic vibrancy and growth to Woodbridge, and get funding for a new landscaping and litter control project. Together we have been able to accomplish a great deal and I hope to be able to continue our work together.





Woodbridge District Supervisor Margaret Angela Franklin addresses the Criminal Activity on and around Richmond Highway

WOODBRIDGE, VA - Supervisor Margaret Angela Franklin has prioritized

Community Safety since assuming the role of Woodbridge District Supervisor. Recently, there has been a noticeable uptick in criminal activity surrounding the area on Richmond Highway and Prince William Parkway. Supervisor Franklin has been working with Prince William County Police and Prince William County Public Schools to determine effective means to address incidents that have occurred in this area. Supervisor Franklin urged the following changes:





- The Prince William County Police Department will provide additional patrols for this area and has collaborated with the property owner to ensure "No Trespassing" signs have been placed behind the 7-11. This step allows police to enforce the County's no trespassing ordinance.
- Prince William County Public Schools, which has purchased the property behind the 7-11, has agreed to trim the tree lines for better visibility from Prince William Parkway - providing greater visibility to deter criminal activity.
- Prince William County Public Schools has agreed to put up lights behind the 7-11 to help deter criminal activity.
- The Homeless population has been offered services through the Prince William County Social Services Department and relocated.



Supervisor Franklin states "It is important to address criminal activity at its roots and these actions will help move us towards that goal".

Supervisor Franklin hosted her third Public Safety Town Hall on Wednesday, January 18th to discuss the recently approved Community Safety Initiative

(CSI). The Prince William Board of County Supervisors (BOCS) approved the Community Safety Initiative, which aims to target violence at its roots – through community involvement and proven holistic measures. Supervisor Margaret Angela Franklin Announces Route 1 Corridor Public Transportation Improvement Project



Supervisor Margaret Angela Franklin announced plans, at a recent meeting of the Prince William Board of County Supervisors, to continue her efforts to enhance and improve the Route 1 Corridor (Richmond Highway). The Route 1 Corridor Public Transportation Improvement Project involves adding bus stop shelters and trash receptacles at 13 Omniride bus stops along Route 1. The project also includes making each of the 13

bus stops compliant with requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act, ensuring that all residents have access to public transportation. The bus stop shelters also encourage people to use public transit and enhance their experience by offering safety and security.

This latest effort by Supervisor Franklin follows her other efforts to revitalize the Route 1 Corridor. She led the effort to change the name of Route 1 from Jefferson Davis Highway to Richmond Highway, and ensured that businesses adversely impacted by the name change could receive grants for those expenses. According to Franklin, "Route 1 (Richmond Highway) is the heart of the Woodbridge District and we deserve a vibrant, dynamic, and safe community for those who drive and those who use public transportation."

Supervisor Margaret Angela Franklin is Excited About the New Distribution Center Coming to Woodbridge



Supervisor Margaret Angela Franklin attended the groundbreaking ceremony of the new Distribution Center on Dabney Road. This 113,000 square-foot Distribution Center will bring businesses and jobs to Woodbridge!

It will span 113,490 square feet and will be located on Dabney Road. This project represents an investment of \$22.5m and will provide

close to 100 new jobs in supply chain logistics. It will be the inaugural development project in the new E-Commerce Overlay in Prince William County. Many of the jobs created by such projects often require business card printing services.

The Normandy Opportunity Zone Fund, LP, and the Pinkard Group purchased the property in 2021. They also demolished the vacant warehouse buildings that were on two parcels of land adjacent to the property.

Principal of The Pinkard Group, Fred Underwood, said that issues regarding the supply chain have been of utmost importance for consumers and concern among many corporations around the world. He said that this high-bay modern facility will provide excellent access and increased functionality for last-mile distribution operations.

The 95 East Distribution Center is the first new project of an industrial nature east of Interstate 95 in Woodbridge in over 10 years and coincides with road work being finished to revitalize and widen the Route 1 corridor. Woodbridge District Supervisor, Margaret Franklin, expressed her thrill about this project that will bring new jobs and new tenants to the community.



The new fulfillment facility is expected to be operational by next summer.

Supervisor Margaret Angela Franklin Urges Sanctions on Local Entities Associated with Violent Criminal Activity

Gun violence continues to shatter lives and communities across our nation including right here in Woodbridge. The time between tragedies gets shorter and shorter. However, we cannot allow ourselves to become numb to the horror and tragedy of these events. Nor can we ignore the pain and suffering of gun violence victims and their families.

The North Woodbridge area is currently undergoing major revitalization efforts. But while this has been a positive change, we have also seen significant challenges. That is why I am urging our public safety officials to utilize the full weight of its authority to bring sanctions against any entity enabling the



tide of violent criminal activities occurring on their premise, particularly if there have been numerous violent crimes occurring on the same premise. I will continue to work in guaranteeing that there are significant resources needed to address violent crimes, but this will take much needed cooperation. I have spoken to county officials as well as our police about the need for more resources and I expect to see those resources in full effect moving forward.

Supervisor Franklin has also done the following:

- Issued a directive on October 11 for staff to determine the availability of federal funding for gun violence prevention programs and services. Specifically, this directed the study and review of the Bipartisan Safer Community Act for sources of "funding for programs, services, or equipment that Prince William County can use to make our schools and communities safer."
- Urged the Acting County Executive to work alongside the police department and the Deputy County Executive for Public Safety to develop a public safety plan to address gun violence among other issues throughout our county.
- Hosted a town hall on Gun Violence Prevention, on June 22 and a town hall on Public Safety on August 16. Hosted joint meetings with several apartment management companies and the police department on ways that better security measures can enhance and improve the quality of life of Woodbridge residents.
